She is the director of the Adult Literacy Program that is part of the Fisher Landau Center for the Treatment of Learning Disabilities at the Children's Evaluation and Rehabilitation Center at Montefiore (CERC) in the Bronx, NY. In her role as psychologist, she conducts psychoeducational evaluations and provides psychoeducational treatment to adults who have had life-long learning struggles.

Dr. McQuaid also sees children and young adults with learning and attention challenges for evaluation in her private practice. Dr. McQuaid previously worked at Blythedale Children's Hospital as a pediatric neuropsychologist.

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
