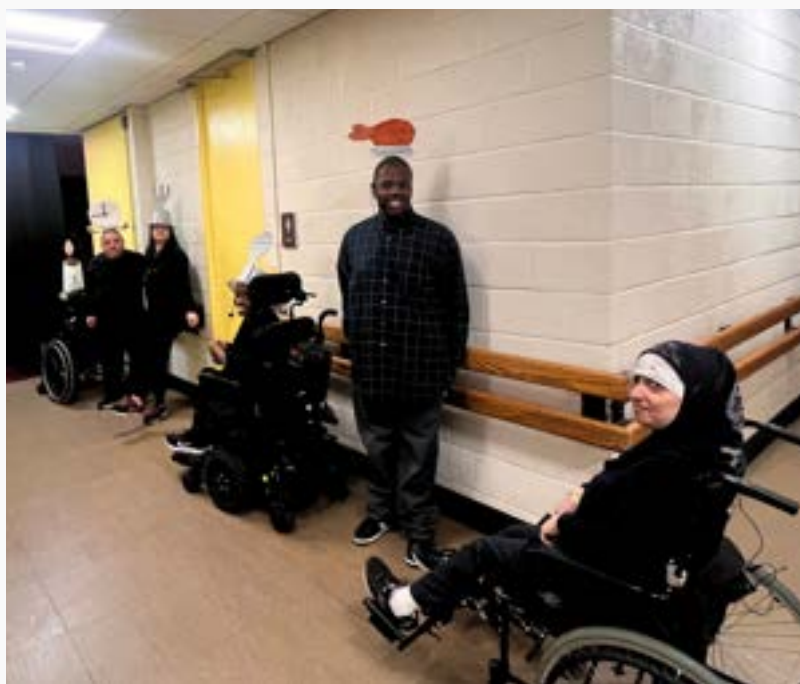

BACKSTAGE AT THE MUSICAL REVUE



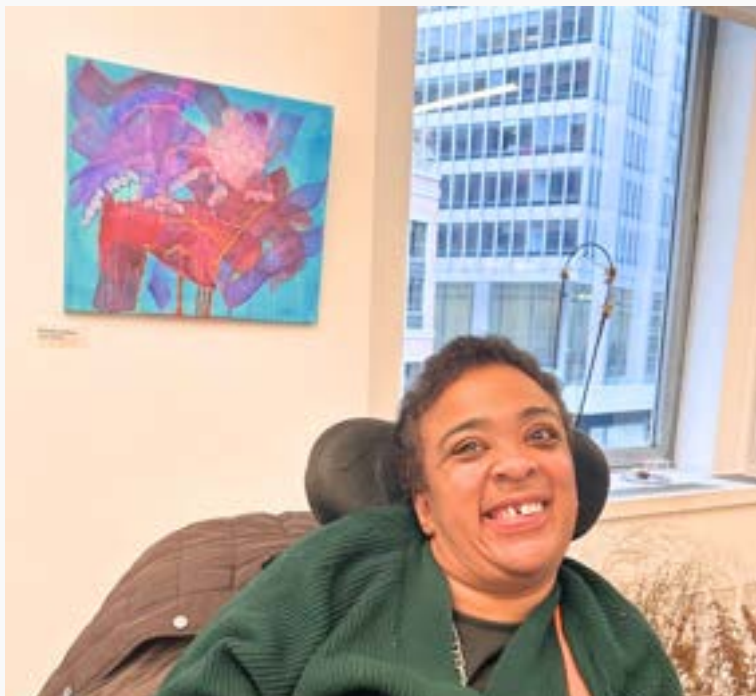

Participants used the computer lab to learn and practice using artificial intelligence as an educational and creative tool. Through hands-on activities, they explored how AI can support storytelling by creating fictional narratives inspired by personal interests such as dance and Caribbean culture. These sessions encouraged creativity, digital confidence, and curiosity about emerging technology. This work builds on recent momentum from a City Council discretionary funding grant awarded to support AI education for people with disabilities through the Community Outreach team.



SERVING WITH HEART



In partnership with LIFT Community Food Pantry, ADAPT volunteers supported a meaningful community event in anticipation of Christmas, helping provide patrons with a healthy meal featuring a variety of healthy foods. The three-hour volunteer effort took place entirely outdoors in chilly weather, making the experience both challenging and rewarding. Seeing the smiles and appreciation from community members made it all worthwhile. Participants also helped distribute fresh produce, various meats, non-perishable items, and plenty of care to share.
